Two most popular (free) AI tools

ChatGPT

- App available on iPhone or Android smartphones
- Website: ChatGPT.openai.com

Copilot

- App available on iPhone or Android smartphones
- Website: Copilot.microsoft.com

Copilot is recommended as the superior AI tool for family history research and other applications.

Just ask Copilot a question or tell it to do something (e.g. draw a picture, compose something, etc.)

Ask follow-up questions as in an interactive conversation.

A digital library with the stated mission of "universal access to all knowledge". It provides free public access to collections of digitized materials, including websites, software applications/games, music, movies/videos, moving images, and millions of books. The Internet Archive holds:

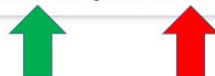

What you are looking for may be a specific title or a generic description of what you are looking for.

Some books may be accessed freely; others with copyright may require your sign-on information. Borrow one hour at a time.

An account is free, safe, and without pesky solicitations for premium service.

Google Books



Every word in 40+million books is indexed. Search for a character string—such as an ancestor's name.

Remember!!

1. Use Google Books to **find** title and page no. of a book with information
2. Use Internet Archive to **read** the information in the book
