This advertisement was printed in the newspaper, "The Broome Republican," published in Binghamton, Broome County, New York, a town 20 miles away. This advertisement was found in the issue printed on May 1, 1831, and it appears that the ad first appeared on March 1, and that 3 months later the home had still not sold. A local attorney helped Joseph Knight, Sr. sell the farm. The house icon appeared in many of the little advertisements with homes and farms for sale in that newspaper.
